

Assiniboine Park Conservancy is Celebrating New Outdoor Gardens at The Leaf, August 27-29

Winnipeg, August 27, 2021 — The Assiniboine Park Conservancy (APC) is inviting visitors to discover the new outdoor Gardens at The Leaf this weekend at Assiniboine Park. The opening of the gardens earlier this summer marked the return of a significant and beautifully revitalized area of Assiniboine Park to the community for year-round enjoyment. With close to 30 acres of new gardens and greenspace, this is a major milestone in Assiniboine Park's ongoing redevelopment.

APC staff, board members, and project stakeholders, including representatives from the Province of Manitoba and the City of Winnipeg, gathered in the new Performance Garden this morning to honour this milestone and launch the three-day celebration.

This afternoon and over the course of the weekend, park visitors can take in a variety of pop-up performances by local musicians and dancers, culinary demonstrations, and other fun and engaging events. Activities and performances will take place in various locations throughout the expansive gardens. There will also be a selection of multi-cultural food trucks available on site.

The outdoor Gardens at The Leaf include six unique gardens: Indigenous Peoples Garden, Kitchen Garden, Sensory Garden, Performance Garden, Seasonal Garden, and The Grove.
